Dear Parents and Guardians, This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	In English, we will be linking our writing with our Topic this term 'Modern and Ancient Greece'. The children will be using their developing knowledge of this European country and period in history to write a variety of genres/text types; newspaper report, diary writing, playscripts, setting descriptions, biography, information, text, persuasive text and Greek myths. Our Class reading books for this term are 'Greek Tales: The Boy who Cried Wolf by Terry Deary and we will also be studying the book 'Here Comes Hercules' by Stella Tarakson and looking at Greek Myths. The children will continue to consolidate their reading strategies and comprehension of a variety of texts and answer questions based upon them. We will also continue to consolidate previous learning and broaden the children's understanding and use of grammatical techniques and devices, both in their extended writing and in isolated lessons when we will focus on SPaG such as direct speech (inverted commas) and punctuating fronted adverbials with commas.
Maths	In Maths, the children will be studying number and place value. We will be learning to add and subtract numbers up to 4 digits (and beyond) using formal written methods and to recall multiplication and division facts to 12x12. Alongside learning our times tables, we will learn formal written methods of multiplication and division. Throughout the maths explored this term, children will work on developing their ability to solve number and practical problems using the basic skills of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. This term, Maths will also include measuring area and perimeter, statistics work looking at line graphs and tables and examining time conversions and timetables.
Science	In Science this term, we will explore different materials, their uses and their properties, as well as dissolving, separating mixtures and irreversible changes. The children will sort and classify objects according to their properties. They will explore the properties of materials to find the most suitable material for different purposes.
Computing	Understand computer networks, including the internet; how they can provide multiple services, such as the World Wide Web, and the opportunities they offer for communication and collaboration Use search technologies effectively, appreciate how results are selected and ranked, and be discerning in evaluating digital content
Geography	This term, we will take a look at Modern Greece, finding out where it is, by locating it on a map of Europe and exploring major cities including it's capital city and the many surrounding islands. We shall identify Greece's key physical and human features, understand the climate and compare it to the UK's and finally consider why it is a popular visitors attraction and how it has changed over time.
History	We will study the historic period of 'Ancient Greece' this term. We will start by considering who the Ancient Greeks were, with a particular focus on Alexander the Great and his impact on the Greek empire. The children will find out how the Olympic games originated in Greece and consider whether the events of the Trojan horse story really happened. During our study of this historical period we will explore the Ancient Greek's achievements and their influence on the western world with a particular focus on democracy.
RE	Throughout this term we will be learning about Christianity. The children will consider what Christians believe in God through looking at stories from the Bible such as The parable of the Sheep and goats. We will look at how Christians believe God has asked them to be good stewards to the Earth through the parable of the talents and how this affects the way they live their lives.
PSHE	This term the children will be exploring relationships as well as rights and responsibilities. They will consider scenarios and discuss and share their thoughts and feelings about these, respecting one another's opinions.
Music	This term the children will have music lessons delivered by Mr Male where they will be learning more about the guitar. Later in the term, we will rehearse popular Christmas songs and carols in preparation for a Christmas performance.
D & T & ART	Continue to use sketch books to record observations and use them to review and revisit ideas; complete willow sculptures using the Design, Make and Evaluate framework. In autumn 2, children will complete Christmas decorations as part of a product development process.
PE	The children will be increasing their skills and techniques using a variety of equipment in gymnastics, practising and performing individual sequences. They will further develop their confidence, skills and ability in a range of invasion and striking games. During the Autumn term the children will have their weekly swimming lessons at Wincanton Sports centre, starting with the Year 5s in the first half of the Autumn and the Year 4s following in the second half term of Autumn.
MFL	The children will be acquiring a proficiency in day-to-day French words and phrases. They will be learning enhancing their conversation skills, singing songs and using a variety of interactive activities.
