Already this year, up to the beginning of October 2025, the Lord's Larder has helped 5,678 adults and 3,684 children in need, covering towns and villages in South Somerset and North West Dorset, an area including Yeovil, Martock, Crewkerne, Ilminster, Somerton, Henstridge and Templecombe, working with agencies who request and then deliver the emergency food parcels to their clients. Your donation will make a real difference to help to meet the continued demand for food parcels, now and into 2026. Thank you.




