
Dear Parents, this letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	In English we will be linking our writing with our history topic this term 'Anglo Saxons and Scots'. The children will be using their developing knowledge of this period in history to write a variety of genres/text types; newspaper report, diary writing, non-chronological reports, character descriptions, informal letters, adventure stories and poetry. Our Class reading book for this term is 'Anglo Saxon boy' by Tony Bradman. The children will continue to consolidate their reading strategies and comprehension of a variety of texts and answer questions based upon them. We will also continue to develop the children's use of grammatical techniques and devices, such as direct speech (inverted commas) and how to accurately use a range of tenses such as the past, present and future perfect form of verbs.
Maths	In Maths the children will be developing their knowledge of negative numbers and interpreting them in context. We will be learning to identify multiples and use factor pairs leading to finding common factors of two numbers. We will count in multiples of 6,7,9, 25 and 1,000 and Year 5's will develop their knowledge of square and cube numbers. We will spend time growing confident when working with fractions including; finding equivalent fractions, comparing and ordering fractions, adding and subtracting fractions. We will then link our work with fractions to extend our knowledge of decimal numbers.
Science	In Science, we will be learning about our digestive system and compare this with both a cow's and a bird's digestive system to identify similarities and differences. We will also understand the types and functions of teeth and then conduct an experiment to discover what different types of liquids cause varying amounts of tooth decay. Later in the term, we will look at how plants reproduce through pollination and fertilisation and compare the life cycles of these to mammals, amphibians, insects and birds.
Computing	Children will develop their understanding of how digital images can be changed and edited, and how they can then be resaved and reused. They will consider the impact that editing images can have, and evaluate the effectiveness of their choices.
Geography	This term, we will start by identifying the UK on a world map as well as a map of Europe. The countries which make up the UK along with their capital cities will be studied followed by a more general look from the physical features of mountains, rivers and seas to the man-made administrative regions and counties.
History	We will study the historic period of the 'Anglo Saxons and Scots'. Starting with the Roman withdrawal in 410AD, we will lead into the invasions and settlements (kingdoms) of the Anglo Saxons and Scots. The children will have the opportunity to explore general village life which will lead into to our focus on trade and industry during this period in history.
RE	We will be learning about the religion of Judaism including the coming of age ceremonies Bar and Bat Mitzvah, the holiest day in the Jewish calendar 'Yom Kippur' and the significance of the Torah.
PSHE	Children will give examples of people or things that might influence someone to take risks (e.g. friends, peers, media, celebrities), but that people have choices about whether they take risks. Example topics will include the effects of smoking or drinking alcohol on a person's body and give reasons for why most people choose not to smoke, or drink too much alcohol.
Music	This term the children will be learning about the language of music through playing the glockenspiel. The learning is focused around exploring and developing playing skills with the notes C,D E F & G on the glockenspiel through a variety of mixed styles of music. Later in the term we will explore a range of songs from Abba.
ART	The class will produce creative work, exploring their ideas and recording their experiences, culminating in a finished piece to display in the school hall. Children will then evaluate and analyse their creative works using the language of art, craft and design.
PE	The children will continue to develop their confidence, skills and ability in a range of invasion games such as football and tag rugby. Excalibur class will also participate in weekly yoga sessions to develop core strength. We will finish PE this term with a unit on dance where the children will perform and evaluate a range of movements.
MFL	The children will be acquiring a proficiency in day-to-day French words and phrases. They will be learning enhancing their conversation skills, singing songs and using a variety of interactive activities.
