Dear Parents,

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	Developing writing skills across a range of narrative and non-fiction genres; reading comprehension skills with emphasis on inference and deduction; on-going grammar and punctuation skills, handwriting, spelling strategies and rules. Continuing to read a wide range of fiction and non-fiction including poetry.
Mathematics	Solving real life word problems; understanding number; calculating; measuring; statistics (handling data); geometry (understanding shape). Emphasis on using and applying knowledge and skills to investigative tasks. Year 6 to move towards reasoning style problems.
Science	Plants: describing how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including microorganisms, plants; give reasons for classifying plants based on specific characteristics Animals, including Humans: describing the changes as humans develop to old age; recognising the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function; describing the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans
Computing	Understanding how to use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly and how to use search technologies effectively; selecting appropriate programs and Apps to enhance learning opportunities.
Topic	Monarchy and Changing Power: To research an area of the Tudors; To use secondary sources to develop our understanding of key historical figures; To use evidence to build a picture of King Henry VIII; To understand a sequence of events that has led to the expanding power of the monarchy; To use evidence to interpret the life of Queen Elizabeth I; To evaluate the relevance and usefulness of different primary and secondary sources; To compare and contrast the reigns of Elizabeth and Henry
RE	Judaism: Know that Jews have coming of age ceremonies: Bar and Bat Mitzvah (for boys and girls, respectively). These are important because it marks the time when people become responsible for following the Torah. Know that Abraham is called one of the fathers of Judaism know the story of Abraham, who Jews believe was the first person to believe in one God.
PE	Invasion games and Swimming
Languages	French: with emphasis on listening, speaking, writing and developing cultural understanding.
D & T and Art	To use a variety of techniques to add to observational drawings; D&T will be taught later in the term
Music	To research great composers and develop an understanding of the history of music.

Homework

MATHS

Children will receive Maths homework (CGP books) on a Friday to be handed in by Wednesday.

Booster homework will be set for Year 6 children on a Wednesday to be brought in for Tuesday ready for the next booster session.

LITERACY

Children will receive English homework (CGP books) on a Friday to be handed in by Wednesday.

Booster homework will be set for Year 6 children on a Wednesday to be brought in for Tuesday ready for the next booster session.

SPELLING

Weekly spelling tests will be set every Friday and tested the following Friday.

Spellings should be learned everyday, including lists from previous weeks.

Children should be able to spell all words from the Y5/6 statutory Word List. A copy of this can be found on our class webpage.

READING

Reading books and homework should be brought to school and taken home every day.

Children should read at least 4 times a week. This should be for at least 15 minutes per day at home, including once a week reading to an adult. Children need to record their reading in homework diaries and parents to sign weekly. This will be checked every Friday.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- ♦ Mr Gordon will be teaching the Year 5 children on a Wednesday afternoon, whilst Mr Gallagher and Mrs Sherry deliver booster sessions for Year 6.
- ♦ Please ensure your child has a named school PE kit in school at all times. Swimming will take place on Mondays beginning on the 16th September until the October half term and PE will take place on Friday.
- ♦ In addition, pupils have the opportunity to play football or other games on the field at lunchtimes throughout the year. Spare footwear is required for lunchtime field activities.
