Dear Parents,

This letter is designed to provide key information about learning this term. Our overarching themes for the term are 'Creatures Big and Small' and 'Terrific Tales!'. Below you can find the details outlining the content covered for the different areas of learning for the term ahead.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
Communication and Language & English	Children's communication and language development is integrated across all areas of learning and continuous provision opportunities. We will continue to follow our phonics scheme, Little Wandle, to extend our phonics knowledge. This term, we will be learning how to form short phrases and sentences with increasing independence towards Easter. We will continue to focus on correct letter formation. The children will be retelling familiar stories both orally and in writing. We will be looking at non-fiction texts to find out more information related to our theme, 'Creatures Big and Small'.
Maths	In maths we will be diving deep into numbers to 10, including finding number bonds to 5 and 10. We will be looking at the composition of numbers and will apply our addition and subtraction skills to solve problems within 10. When counting, the children will be introduced to 'teen' numbers. Later in the term, we will be exploring doubling and halving and the relationship between them. We will be able to identify even and odd numbers within 10 and understand how they are characterised as such.
Physical Development (PE)	The children enjoy yoga sessions on a Tuesday morning. We also have our PE lessons on a Tuesday afternoon. During PE, children will learn a variety of different skills. This term, PE will have a focus on dance and athletics. The children will learn how to sequence basic movements to develop their balance, agility and co-ordination.
Understanding the World	To develop our understanding of the World, we will be exploring the natural world by learning all about animals, habitats and life cycles. We will discuss different people, cultures and communities through the Somerset AMV Special Places and Special Times, two individual units. There are lots of special celebrations happening this term, including Chinese New Year, Shrove Tuesday, St David's Day, Holi and Easter.
Expressive Arts and Design	In music, we will be listening to, learning to sing or singing along to various action songs. We will be finding the pulse of music and discussing its tempo. Craft opportunities will include clay modelling and using materials to create our own story props.
PSED	We will be following the SCARF units 'Keeping Myself Safe' and 'Rights and Respect'. We will be thinking about how to make safe decisions and risk assess danger as well as looking after others and caring for our world.

We have another busy term ahead with lots of fun things for all to look forward to! The term begins with our topic about 'Creatures Big and Small' which will entail lots of fun learning around animals. The second half of the term sees us looking at a variety of different traditional/ fairy tales. I am very much looking forward to seeing Merlin class interpret these tales in their own retellings.

- Homework is reissued on a Friday. Homework given reflects recent classroom learning and intends to consolidate children's understanding of recently taught concepts. Children should return completed homework every Wednesday please.
- Children will now be bringing home spellings. Please help your child to read and spell the words. There will be no spelling test. We will also be practising these spellings in school throughout the week to support children's confidence at independent spelling. This will support their writing and their ability to segment words to spell. New spelling words will be given every Friday, along with the homework.
