This week's big event was of course the end of year play, performed by members of Lancelot class. Staging a performance of The Little Orphan Girl – based on the musical, Annie – the children performed wonderfully across two performances. Each child had clearly worked really hard to learn their lines and cues brilliantly, the audience enjoying powerful singing and solos as well as props to really bring the performance to life.

Year 6 have had a particularly successful week, with both confirmation that by representing the school, they are all Guinness World Record Holders and the small note of fact that their outcomes from the national Key Stage 2 assessments (SATs) were published on Tuesday.

A full report will be shared in next Holders! week's end of term newsletter, but it is safe to say that the school and families are incredibly proud of your achievements this year. For those who can't wait until next week's Newsletter, our full 2025 data is available on our website, including Reception, Key Stage 1 and Phonics outcomes. I am very pleased to share that all are very strong and all remain above national averages.

Following this, Year 6 visited Ansford Academy for their year group's Sports Festival. It was a joyous occasion of being able to meet form tutors and sport teachers for these children in anticipation for next year, as well as enjoying a whole day of activities alongside their peer groups for next year. Mrs Elsworth was very proud to accompany them for the last festival of the year.

Year 6 took part in a brilliant transition session this week with pupils from Years 7 and 8, all based around the powerful novel, The Final Year by Matt Goodfellow. It was a fantastic opportunity for our Year 6s to hear from older students about what to expect in secondary school and ask any questions they had about the move.

We are delighted to announce we now have a drum set and Charles is available for drum lessons in school each week.


