Somerset Sustainable Futures Launch Event

After a tricky car journey, our day began with a refreshment of squash as we settled at our two tables (a table for the girls and a table for the boys and Mrs Sherry). We had an introduction from the organisers of the event and then were introduced to our timetable for the morning. Excited and enthusiastic, we entered another room

full of a variety of exhibitors to have a look at with the rest of our peers. The first stop was a shipping

map, which used routes for cargo ships to stay out of building sites of power stations and firing zones. The girls started with The National Trust, which was a favourite family stop which they had all visited. Mrs Sherry even tried out VR (Virtual Reality) headset for the first time ever! She was very excited and immediately handed one of the girls her phone for a picture (or a few) to be taken!





The rest of the morning consisted of visits to the exhibits of Wessex Water and The Environment Agency to find out how water waste was cleaned out, what can be found in rivers and what should and shouldn't go down the toilet! The girls had a stop at Kier who explained about the dangers of potholes and how it is their job to fill them in with sustainable resources and how they are planning to power their machines by electricity or vegetable oil. It was a fantastic stop at a quarry mining

company where the boys were taught about what happens in the quarry, how they filter the rocks and also how they operate the vehicles. Then they let them have a go on a simulation machine – which had the real-life controls for an actual machine from the quarry.



Yeovil College was the next stop and we really enjoyed the experience. Tasks involved finding

out what kind of soil it was by dipping a special detecting strip of paper that you had to colour coordinate so you could tell what was in the soil using a key.



The Sustainable Futures Launch Event closed with a speech from James Lawson, a member of Junior Parliament and a young man, who is very passionate about the environment and climate change. Questions were asked during school with a session led by Mrs S, however some of us were put on the spot and were asked to share our thoughts about Climate Change and what could be done in schools and by us as individuals to help our futures on this wonderful planet. We thoroughly enjoyed the



event and think the rest of the year group would rate it 10/10. We hope that the school can take part in the event next year.

I would like you to join me in congratulating the following children who were recognised this week by their teachers for excellent hard work and dedication:




