
Dear Parents & Guardians,

While some games and apps cost money, most are free to download and use. But are they actually free?

Online companies use clever tactics to make money through products and services they market as being free. These tactics are not always obvious, and some can be very persuasive, especially those aimed at children. The Better Internet for Kids (BIK) portal offers resources dedicated to understanding marketing in games. It explains how marketing strategies are embedded in online

games and apps and offers practical advice on how to recognise these tactics and help our children understand them. By using these tools, parents can better protect and guide their children while they are online.

'Tuning in to Teens' shows you how to help your teen develop emotional intelligence.


Adolescents with higher emotional intelligence:
