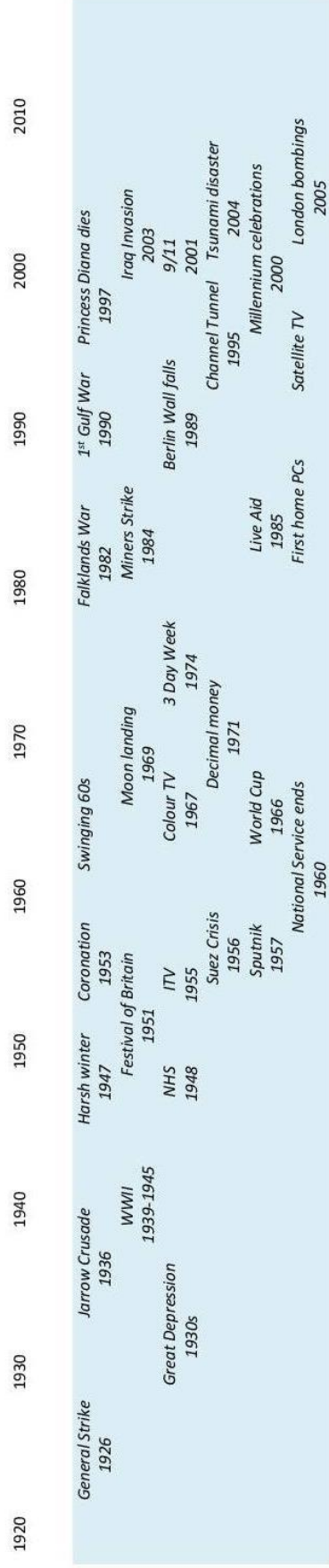

Re: Compulsory Purchase of Crooked House, Crooked Lane

I am writing on behalf of the local council to inform you that a compulsory purchase order is about to be issued on your property.

Your property has been deemed unfit for human habitation. It is a health hazard to yourself and a danger to you or anyone visiting your property. Consequently the council has decided, in accordance with the Housing Act 1985, that your property will need to be demolished.
