- 3. Full stops


Try to make sure that your writing is as interesting and as exciting as you can make it. Using super words to describe. Above all have fun writing!

When thinking of words to describe your animal you may want to use your five senses to help you:











This is Charlie:





Thanks to the vet, the patient soon began to feel much better.


On Wednesday, Cam the chameleon visited the vet. He had a temperature. The vet put a cool flannel on Cam's head and gave him plenty of water to drink.

Thanks to the vet, the patient soon began to feel much better.








