9. What does the term 'Mother Earth' tell you about Native American religion?
10. What does the term 'sacred' mean to you?
11. What aspects of Native American culture do you see in the film (what traditions/customs)?
12. Is there any cause that you would be prepared to do something similar for? Why is it so important?
