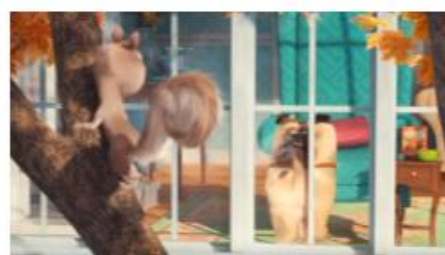


Subjunctive Exercise 2: A guide to leaving your pet at home.

Using the subjunctive and sentence starters, write a text advising new pet owners how to look after their pets who are left at home.

Success Criteria:
* Subheadings (<u>Cats</u> , <u>Dogs</u> , <u>Birds</u>)
* At least 3 sentences using the subjunctive (<u>underlined</u>) for each pet
* Modal verbs (<i>would, could, may, must</i>)
* Complex sentences with subordinating conjunctions (<i>because, otherwise, so, or else, as, so that</i>)



Example:

Cats:

If your cat were left alone, he may try to steal from the fridge. I suggest that your fridge be locked at all times. It is important that the cat eat only his own food, otherwise you will starve!

Subjunctive Starter 1	If [your cat] were, he.....	
Subjunctive Starter 2	I advise that [he]...	I propose that
	I recommend that	I suggest that
	I insist that	I urge that
Subjunctive Starter 3	It is best that [your cat]...	It is recommended that
	It is crucial that	It is important that
	It is desirable that	It is vital that
	It is essential that	It is a good idea that
	It is imperative that	It is a bad idea that

Remember:

was → were (If I were you, I would help.)

is/are/am → be (My teacher asks we be quiet in assembly.)

any other verbs → use base form, e.g. have, eat, want (His mum insists he stop now.)
