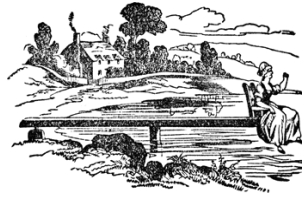

Art – Follow the guides over the next few pages to produce a 3D drawing of a Tudor house like the one below.

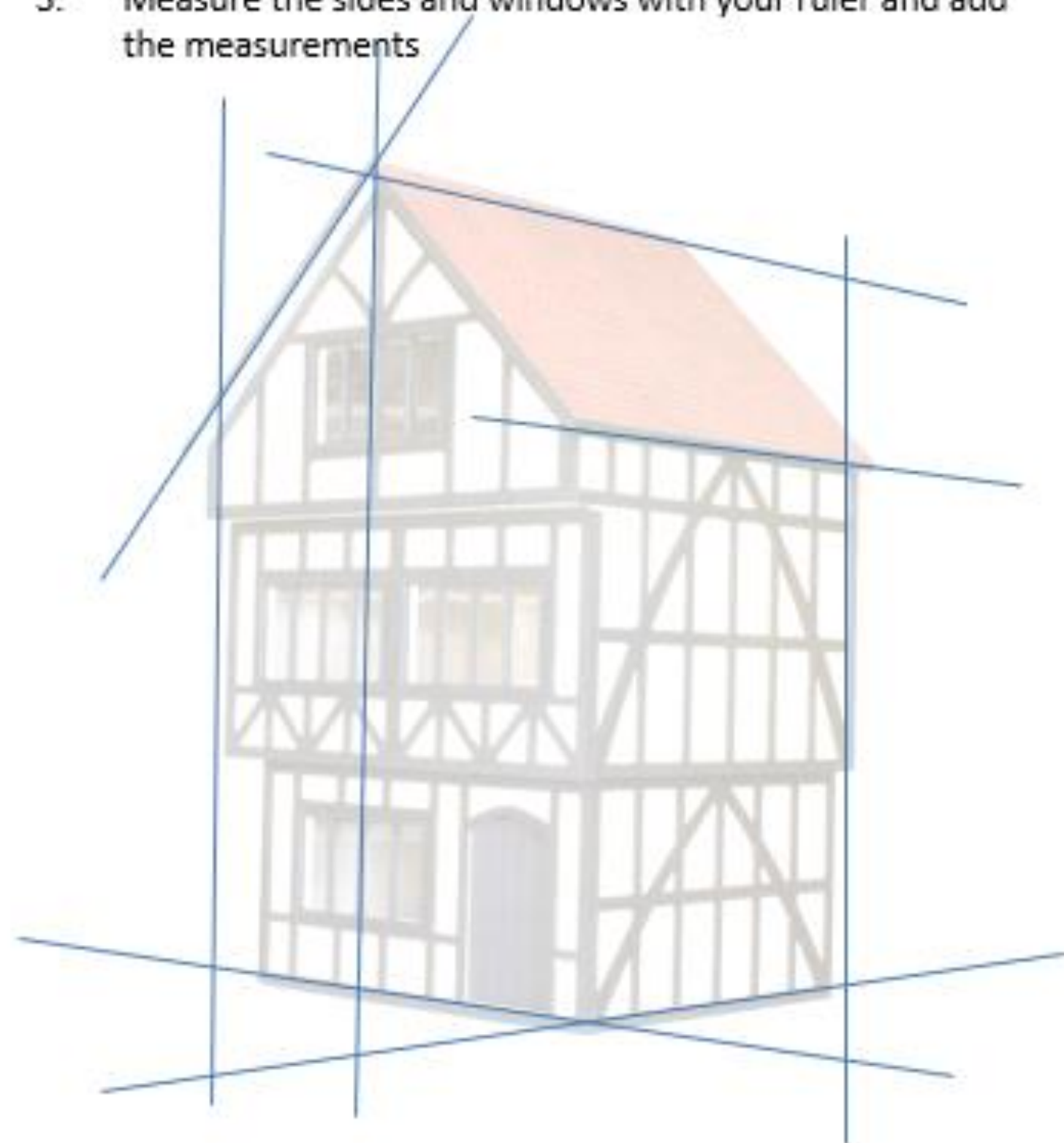
Top Tip: Press lightly with your pencil until you are happy with any lines you draw (easier to rub out)

Task: Using a ruler and pencil, attempt to copy a 3D house:

1. Use Pencil lightly first to draw the key lines.
2. Once done, press harder to show the outline of the edges.
3. Measure the sides and windows with your ruler and add the measurements



4. Now look at the details of the original drawing below and add details such as the timber frame, roof tiles, windowpanes etc.
5. Add colour, if you wish.
