Maths

Much of the English is fairly self-explanatory, but where necessary extra input will be provided (particularly for some of the specific grammar tasks and for the second writing task).

The reading comprehensions link to space for week 1 and mountaineering for week 2 (one of my favourite topics!). Our writing tasks include suspense/horror and then a little creative freedom as you design a story based on some pictures. Grammar wise, we're almost there in terms of topic coverage so it is a little bit of revision and some learning about how to use lots of tenses!
