Food safety and nutrition policy

Aim

Our setting is a suitable, clean, and safe place for children to be cared for, where they can grow and learn. We meet all statutory requirements for food safety and fulfil the criteria for meeting the relevant Early Years Foundation Stage Safeguarding and Welfare requirements.

Objectives

- We recognise that we have a corporate responsibility and duty of care for those who work in and receive a service from our provision, but individual employees and service users also have responsibility for ensuring their own safety as well as that of others. Risk assessment is the key means through which this is achieved.
- Following dietary guidelines to promote health also means taking account of guidelines to reduce the risk of disease caused by unhealthy eating.
- Parents share information about their child's particular dietary needs with staff when they enrol their child and in an ongoing basis with their key person. This information is shared with all staff who are involved in the care of the child.
- Care is taken to ensure that children with food allergies do not have contact with food products that they are allergic to.
- Risk assessments are conducted for each individual child who has a food allergy or specific dietary requirement.
