SPAG revision Complete SPAG tasks 7 and 8. EXT: Find a story of interest on either the Guardian or the Times websites – what attracted you to it? What did you learn? Who wrote it? How could you find out more?</p>	<p>English: L.O. Using dialogue to tell a story. We are going to be working from a short section of film this week, available at https://www.literacyshed.com/the-film-trailers-shed.html (just the first clip from La Luna). Our task will be to create dialogue between the characters that creates a story (try not to watch the whole thing first).</p>	<p>English: L.O. Completing writing based on La Luna (using dialogue to tell a story) The piece should now be planned so today is about writing it – remember to use all the conventions of direct speech and try to avoid using 'said'.</p>	<p>English: L.O. Weekly Spelling Test L.O. Create a video news report (Film Task) This will take some planning prior to filming. Firstly, pick a current news story (BBC or ITN news are good). Learn about it by reading/watching. Write a short summary report and then film yourself giving it to camera. Be a journalist – this needs to be professional.</p>
